Ellen Toon has been a dedicated rider for many, many years. In 1992, she achieved a milestone by winning the CHJA Adult Medal Finals, a memorable accomplishment! Throughout her Amateur riding career she had many AO Hunter championships, including WEF, Hampton Classic, Capital Challenge, PNHS, WIHS, and NHS, with the most wonderful horses. An exceptional highlight came in 2023 when her beloved horse In Disguise was inducted into the National Show Hunter Hall of Fame. For about 10 years now Ellen has been judging horse shows across the country and Canada, bringing her experience and knowledge.



Lynn Caristo Forgione, originally from Long Island NY, grew up showing ponies and horses and eventually training out of her family's Glenview Stables with her dad, Ralph Caristo, and stepmother, Holly. As a junior showing in the hunters, she also received a bronze medal in the USET Talent Search class, as well as qualifying for the Medal/Maclay Finals. She has gone on to train multiple winners in the pony, junior and amateur divisions, as well as the indoor circuits. 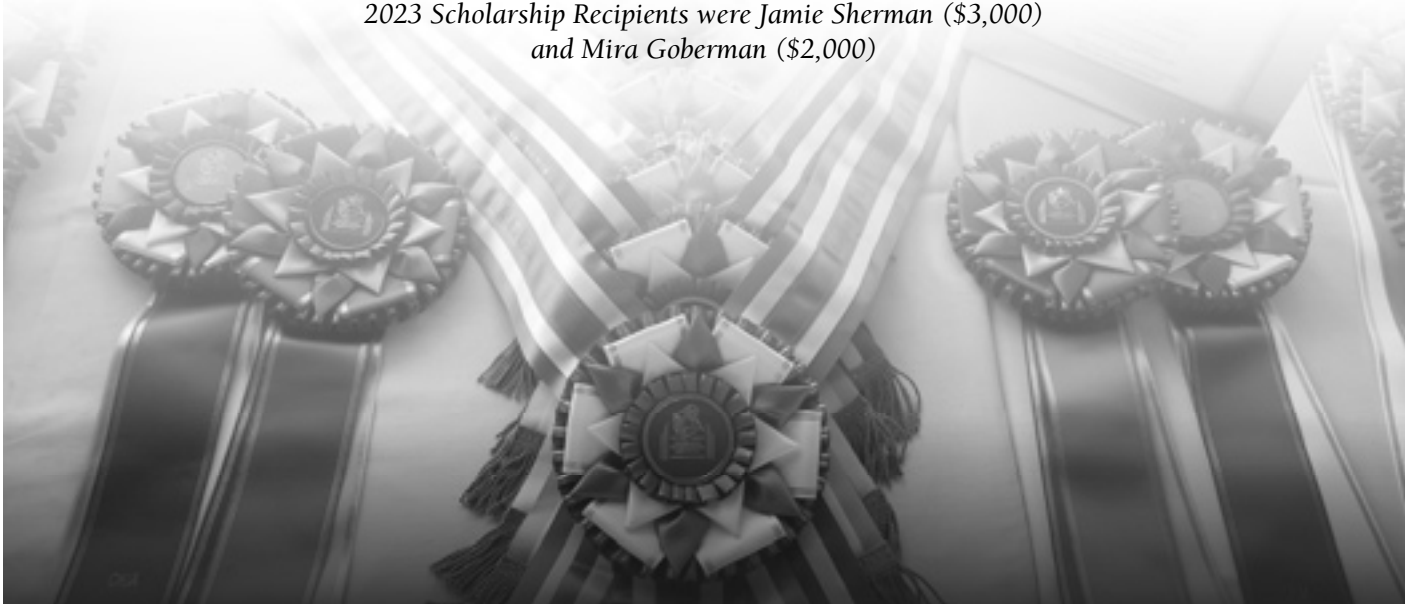

show was in a leadline class in 2014, at the age of 2! And now, at age 11 she was the subject of multiple nominations submitted on her behalf. After reviewing them all, we knew that Autumn possessed the many qualities that make her an ideal recipient of this year's award.

"Autumn cares utmost about the horses and supports her friends and barn mates whether she is winning or learning."

"Autumn is an empathetic rider; with an intuitive sense of what a horse prefers. She never pushes whatever horse she rides to fit her; she adjusts to fit them."

"Autumn takes pride in helping maintain her family's farm. She cleans stalls better than most adults and understands why water buckets need to be scrubbed."

"Autumn is the ultimate team player. She is the first to muck out the horse trailer after a show that she didn't even attend...just to help her friends. If she doesn't have a great round at a show, that never stops her from cheering on her friends and taking videos of her teammates."

Autumn worked hard this summer to qualify for her first ever CHJA Medal Final. Unfortunately, she was recently injured and will be unable to compete. Thankfully, she is expected to make a full recovery and you will still find her at the 2024 CHJA Medal Finals working, grooming, and cheering on her ABF barn team.

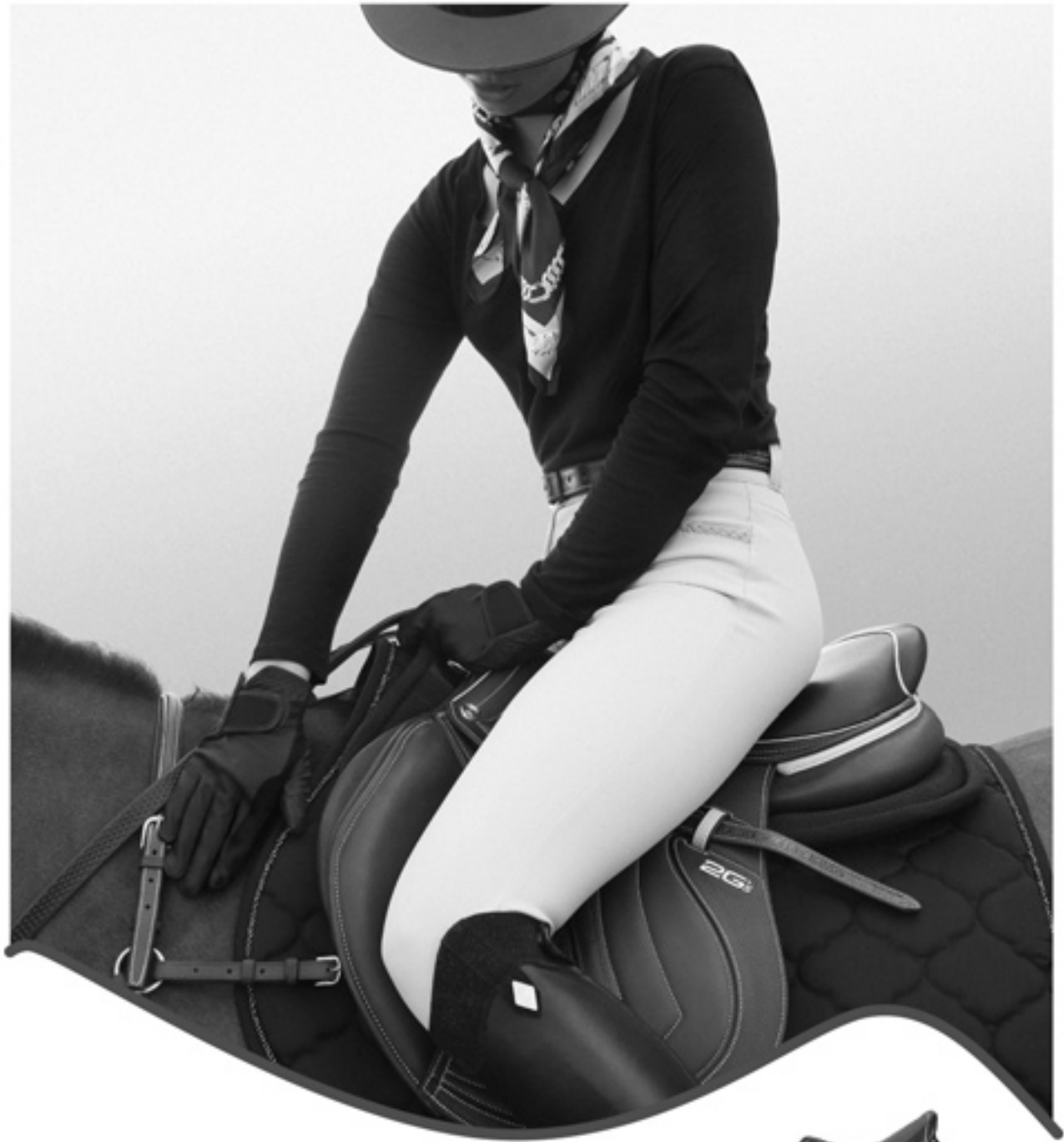

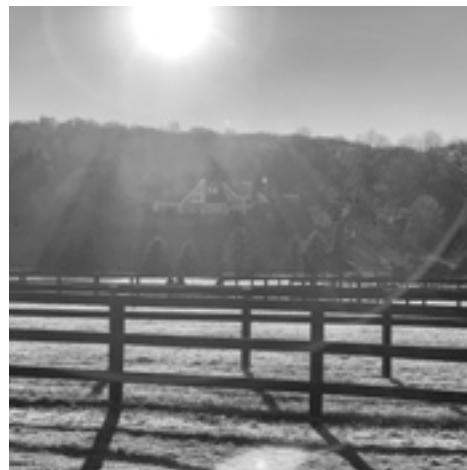

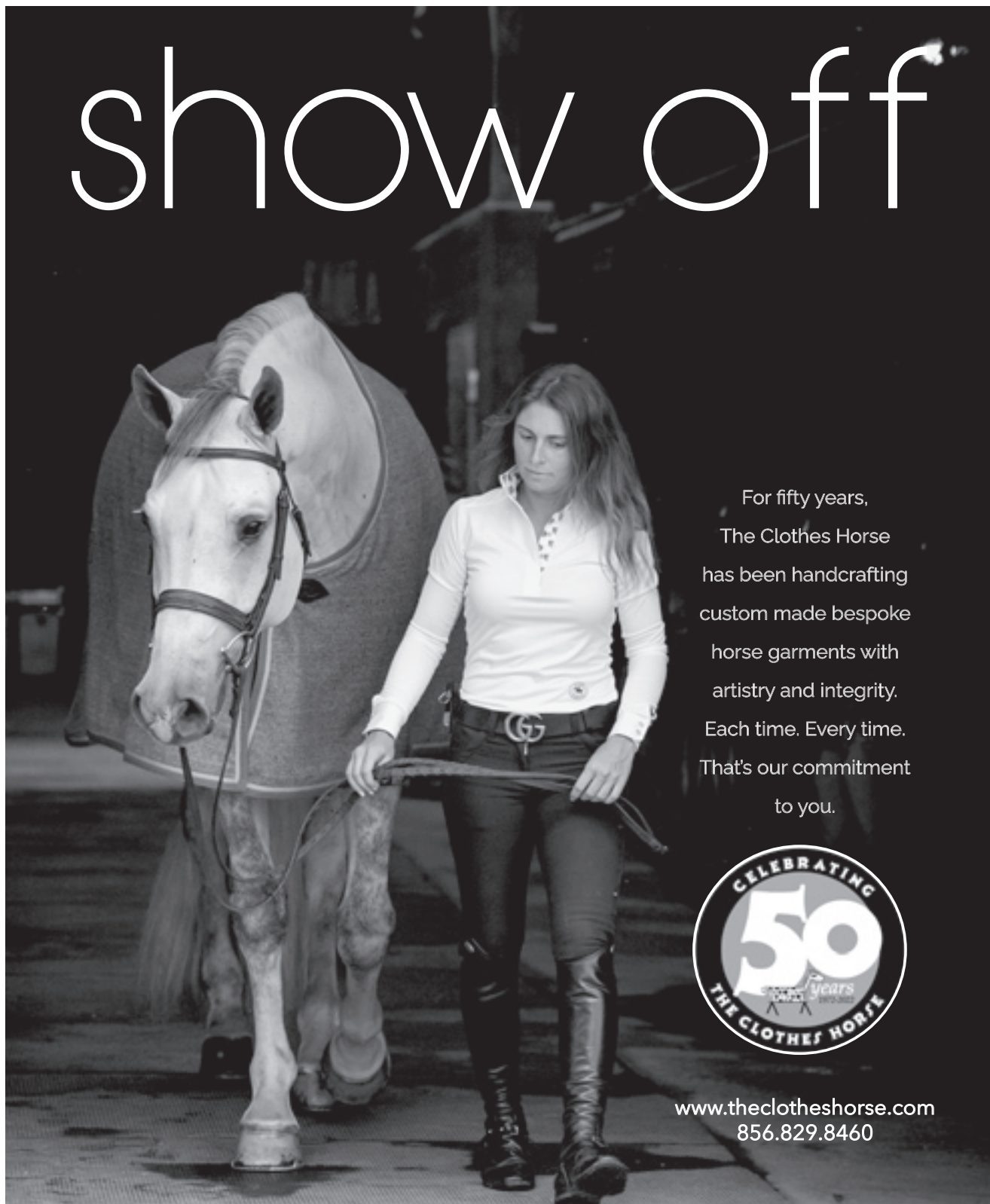

Rider to be a Junior member of the CHJA who has not shown over fences exceeding 2'6" at a recognized horse show. If a rider has ever qualified for or shown in a 2'6" Equitation final including the CHJA Children's Medal, they are no longer eligible for the Pre-Children's Medal. The class consists of two phases. The first phase is over a course of not less than eight obstacles at 2'0" in height, which must contain two changes of direction after the first fence with no combinations permitted. Judges will select twelve contestants (if available) to show at a walk, trot, and canter. The second (flat) phase is mandatory and will count 50%. Riders may show horses or ponies. The same horse/pony to be shown by the same rider in both phases. Judges may require additional testing, using current US Equestrian Tests 1-8.

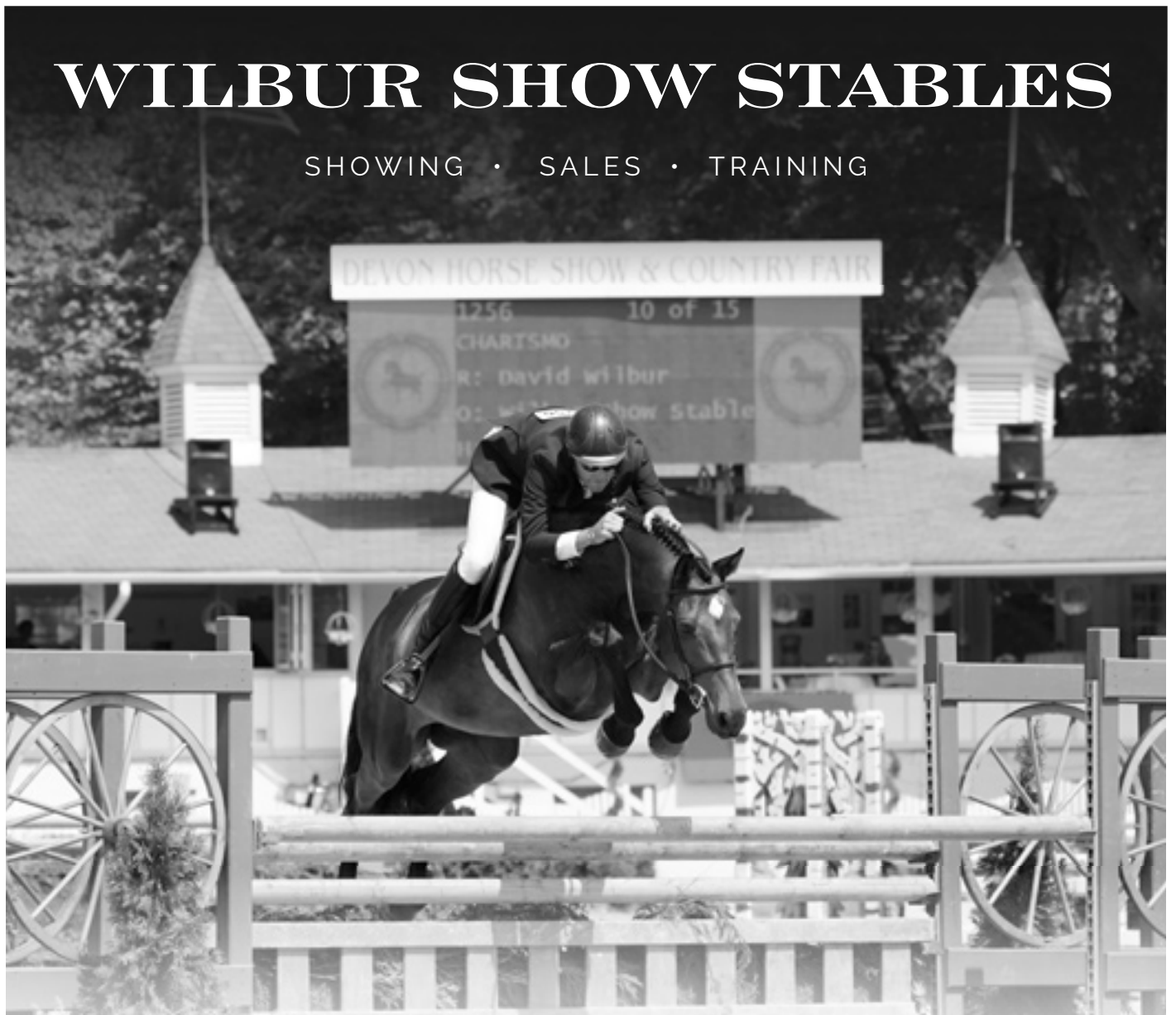

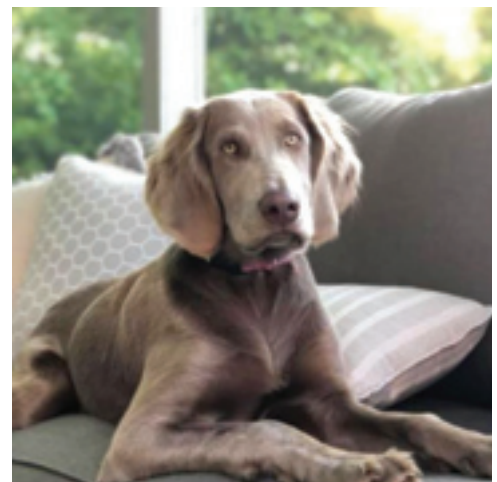
